Summary of Trials Network Engagement Opportunities

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Overview of services available

Trial informational webinars hosted by KRN	KRN clinical trials network sites are actively engaged and experienced in the conduct of nephrology clinical trials. Under the Network-CDA, sponsors may present their trial to the Network. Generally, 2 sessions are held and an average of 20 sites are represented. Sponsors benefit from site awareness and recruitment and may ultimately benefit patient enrollment. Sponsors may also receive questions or protocol feedback of value.
Protocol review by KRN Trials Network KOLs	KRN expert investigators, clinicians, statisticians, study coordinators, and patients (if requested) review and provide protocol feedback. Input from this diverse collection of KOLs improves trial feasibility.
National (U.S.) Recruitment Support	<p>KRN performs the following recruitment services</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ Patient-trials matching via national clinical trial hotline. The hotline is manned to support both patients and clinicians seeking clinical trial opportunities. Through this confidential hotline, patients are pre-screened and referred to their preferred trial site for screening and enrollment. ⇒ KRN patient registry review to support the identification of potentially eligible patients to accelerate trial enrollment. ⇒ Trials listing on KRN website ⇒ Facilitation of pathology-based recruitment efforts
Coordinating Center for Trial	KRN may serve as a full-service coordinating center for clinical trials. This encompasses all aspects including but not limited to trial development; statistical analysis planning; site training, monitoring, and management; data management and analysis; and clinical study reporting. Efficiencies include access to Trials Site Network, network CDA structure, central IRB, and others.
